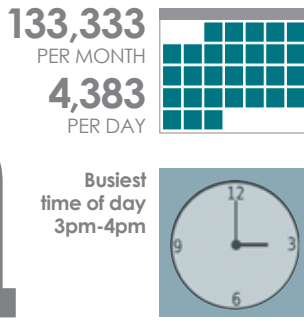

Total Library Visits

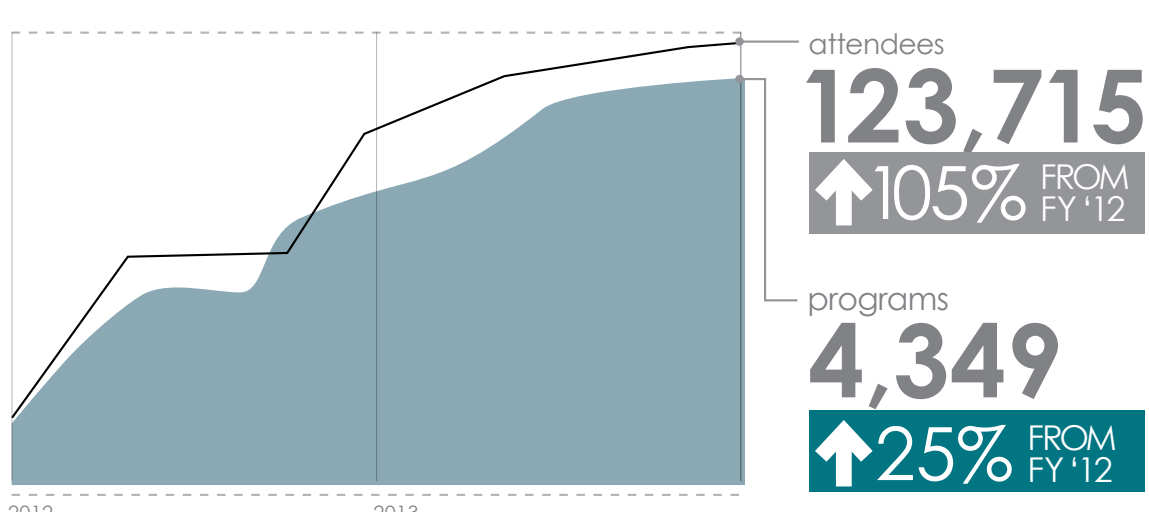

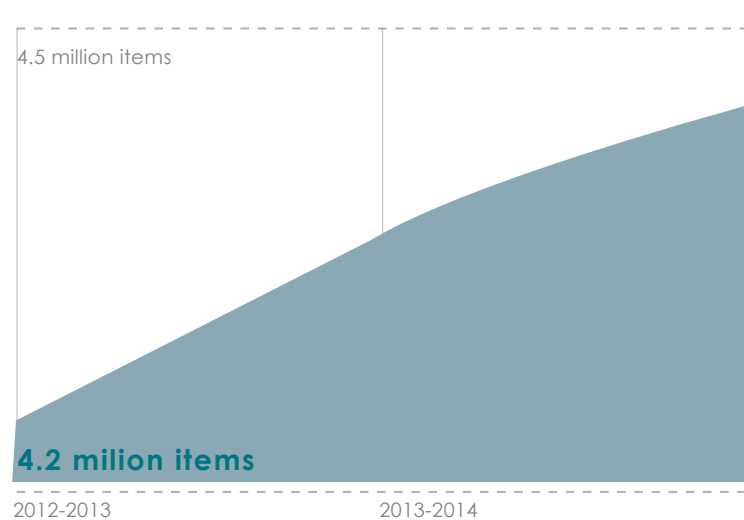

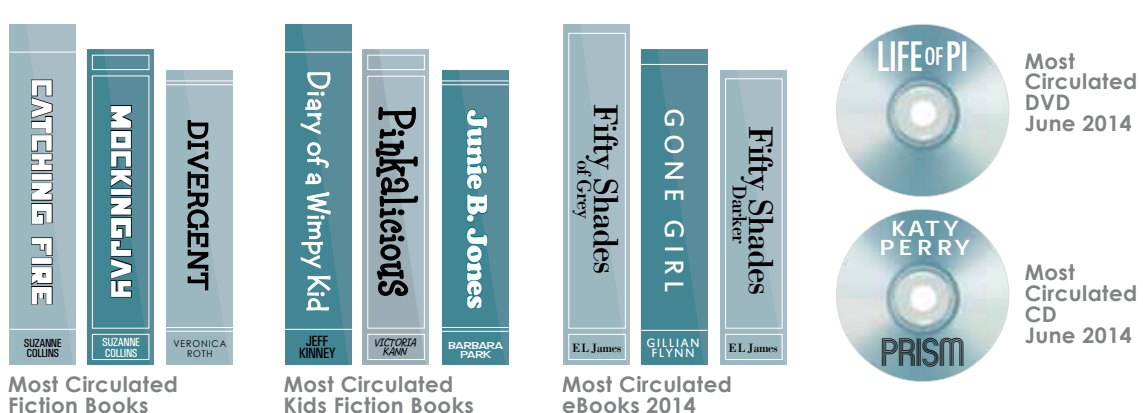

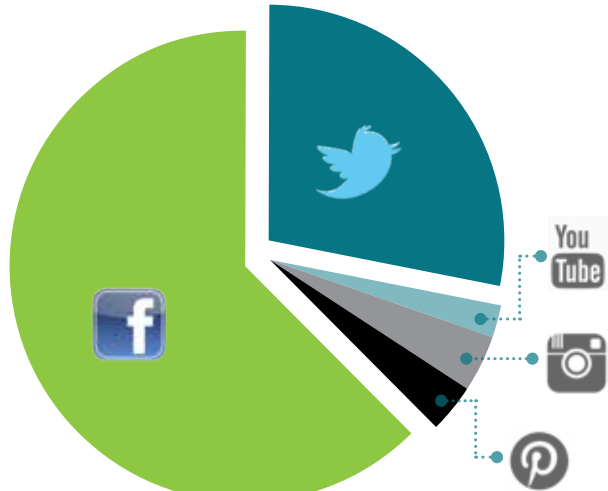

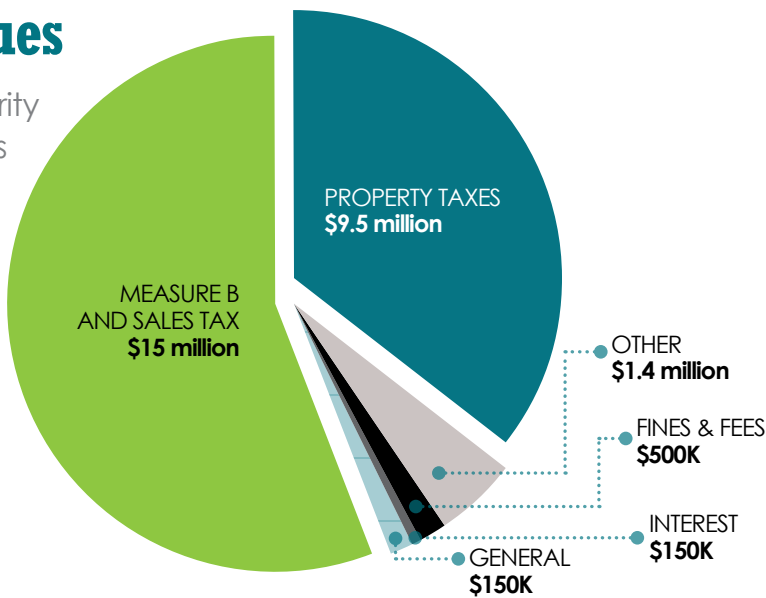
Since 1998, Measure B, a 1/8 of a cent sales tax, has provided additional funds for books, hours, and services for Fresno County residents. Measure B was renewed by voters in 2012 and will continue to support Library programs and services until 2029.

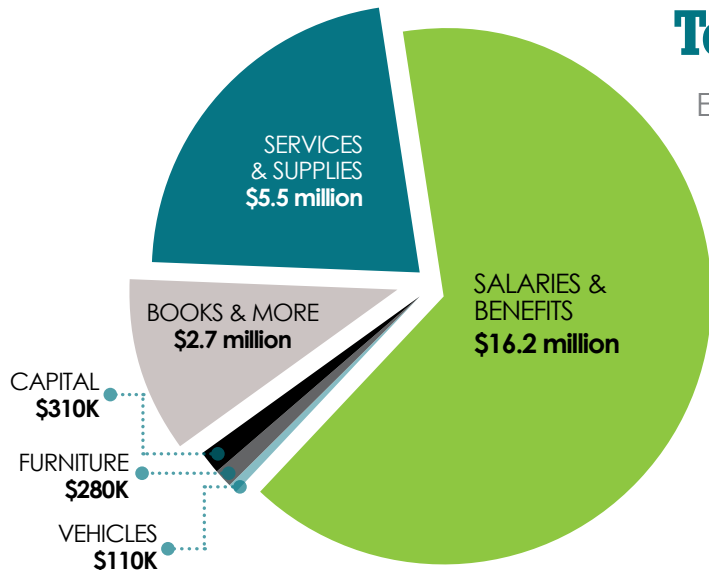


Total Expenditures
