County Librarian's Update May 2014

Facilities

- Sierra Vista Mall Branch.
 - We have our new branch up and running! The grand opening was May 1st and it is working very well.
 - In its first month of operation (our soft opening was April 1st) we had: 766 checkouts; 498 materials were returned; 16 requests for items were placed; and 20 items on hold were picked up. These are very small



numbers, but for a service that had not been promoted until the grand opening, these are impressive. We are the first library in the country (and the world) to put one of these in a shopping mall.

• Opening of the LEAP Center at Sunnyside Regional Library.

With a \$50,000 grant from the California State Library, FCPL was able to open the new LEAP Center (*Learn, Engage, Achieve, Play*) in March. This Center is similar to our Early Learning Centers except the materials and interactives for children focus on kids with learning challenges, such as autism.

Grants

- LSTA Pitch 'n Idea. The Library has been forwarded to the second round of this grant cycle to complete a full application for funding a college readiness program.
- California State Library: \$10,000 (*Books4U Program*). The Library will receive another grant this year with the second round of this program.
- Big Read: \$15,000. The Library has been awarded its 9th grant for the Big Read and this year's title is The Maltese Falcon.
- ELF Grant: \$4,643 which partially funded the Early Learning Center at Cedar-Clinton Library.

- Bob Kolbert: \$10,500 (Early Learning Center at Fig Garden)
- Whitney Foundation: \$30,000 (Early Learning Centers at Orange Cove and Mendota)

Budget Priorities for FY2014/15

This year we plan to continue with the successes of previous years:

- Expand programs and services through the introduction of Early Learning Centers at Mendota, Orange Cove, Fig Garden and Cedar-Clinton and finalize the roll-out of the WoW! Library.
- Focus on staff training and development, starting with our 100th Annual Staff Day on October 13, 2014.
- Refurbish facilities, working with the Friends of the Library to assist with furniture replacements (reading tables, chairs, and lounge seating).
- Increase the total service hours available throughout the system with the implementation of new service hours at select branches in July 2014.
- Replace worn out materials and add new materials, focusing on ordering more e-collections.
- Maintain current facilities in order to provide a safe and welcoming environment with the hiring of additional maintenance staff, planned replacements of plumbing fixtures, new carpet, and replacement of overgrown landscaping at select facilities.
- Construct new libraries and remodel existing facilities with the selection of sites for a new Clovis and Reedley branch, which will then include the launch of local fundraising campaigns for each facility. Additionally there is the possible move of the Cedar-Clinton and Politi libraries to larger and more modern facilities, and the move of the Headquarters and Administrative operations so the Central Library renovation can take place.
