Fresno County Librarian Laurel Prysiazny announced today that with the support of the public as many Fresno County libraries as possible will remain open next week with volunteers assisting staff to cover any absences created by those employees participating in the upcoming SEIU strike.

"Our priority is to maintain service levels to the greatest extent possible to continue to meet people's information and educational needs. The Library is the one-stop-shop for many, including using Internet access to apply for jobs, e-mail with family in other locales, and conducting research for school assignments. Ensuring everyone, including children and their families can continue to use our libraries is our top priority during the SEIU strike," said Prysiazny.
